The Arcade Library, a 12,686 square-foot branch, was last remodeled in 2005. The current improvements upgrade, rearrange, and refresh the building to accommodate contemporary and emerging library services. The Arcade Library plan reflects the changing needs of customers by improving technology resources, ergonomics, access to collections and services, and overall functionality of space. Learning spaces will enrich experiences and exploration for youth and families at the library and access to the unique collections in the “Library of Things,” have been improved.

Priorities for interior improvements:

- Create a distinct family friendly space for children that is welcoming and inviting, including an early literacy area
- Create a Teen space with furniture and teen computers
- Create an improved easy-to-navigate layout that highlights an inviting browsing area, the “Library of Things,” collections, and other services relevant to the community
- Provide new and additional seating that is both comfortable and functional with access to more power outlets throughout the building
- Improve workflow efficiency and ergonomic functionality of the staff work room and workstations
- \$10,000 donation in memory of Tom Sanderson for Design Spot enhancements
- \$5,000 donation from Point-West Rotary to enhance children’s early literacy
