

**NORTH HIGHLANDS-ANTELOPE LIBRARY
 COUNTY OF SACRAMENTO: DISTRICT 4 SUPERVISOR FROST**

The North Highlands-Antelope Library is currently undergoing improvements to enrich the customer’s library experience. Built in 2000, the 12,890 square foot facility, is in need of upgrades to improve access to library services and materials for all of its community members. In addition to replacing worn furniture and carpet, emerging library service patterns were used to determine improvements in the layout, in technology, and to identify age-specific learning spaces for children and teens. North Highlands-Antelope Library will welcome customers back to learn and explore the new space, in late spring 2017.

Priorities for interior improvements:

- Create a distinct family friendly space for children that is welcoming and inviting including an early literacy area with one additional AWE early learning children’s computer
- Enhance and define the Teen space – new furniture, additional teen computers
- Create an inviting browsing area with an improved easy-to-navigate layout that highlights materials, collections, and services relevant to the community.
- Provide new and additional seating that is both comfortable and functional with access to more power outlets throughout the building.
- \$13,823 from the Sacramento Public Library Foundation to provide new children's Russian language materials, early learning manipulatives, and interactive design elements.
